A BRIEF SKETCH OF ELDER MOSLEY'S LECTURE

A stereopticon lecture on "THE COMING FRAY," was given by Elder J. B. Mosley, Sunady night, November 26th to a large audience. The seating capacity of the church was limited and quite a crowd stood on the outside. In the preamble of his discourse the decision of the League of Nations in one of their meetings at Geneva, Switzerland, was given, which answers to the fulfillment of prophecy.

Micah 4:2, 3 were read as his opening text for the occasion: depicting that while the nations are talking about peace and disarmament, in reality,—the Lord declares that they are making mighty preparation for war. Proof: Joel 2:2, 9-13. Hence, the conferences held to establish peace and disarmament are only camouflage. The picturesque view of Germany's position, which surprised the peace birds, and the impliments of war invented by the nations, stand as indispensible evidences that another world war is looming, and its ultimate outburst is not far ahead.

great political unrest The among the nations,—the continual march of the Turkish nation out of Constantinople with the hope of establishing the seat of their government in the Holy Land,—the outrageous heavals in Europe,—the uproar in the far and near East and the condition ofunsettled League of Nations obviously portray that all things are budding toward a universal carnage.

Jerusalem will be the pivotal point or storm centre. Ezekiel Prophecy predicts 5:5. agencies gathering the nations (Rev. 16:13, 14) and the place where this great battle will be fought. Rev. 16:16. The plain of Esdraelon, the valley of Jehoshaphat and Mount Megiddo were shown on the screen, where the sons of Shem, Ham and Japheth will meet on the gory battlefield to settle the final account with the sword.

Jeremiah was ordained a prophet unto the nation. Jer. 1:5. He saw a seething pot (which is a symbol of Bolshevism) and the face of it was

toward the north. From there this evil was to have been broken out (Jer. 1:13-15) and without doubt the spirit of Bolshevism has pervaded the entire globe; and the result is that the whole world will soon be enveloped into a bloody business of war.

Prophets of old predicted that the Northern nations with the young lions (which symbolize the petty nations of earth) will muster themselves, Ezekiel 38:6, 15, 16; the Eastern nations will prepare for the rush, Rev. 16:12; the United States of America as represented by the two-horned beast of Revelation, 13th chapter, and the other Western nations will be on the scene. Egypt, Ethiopia, Libia and Lidia on the great continent of Africa (south) with their teeming millions, will come up like a flood. Jer. 46:7-10. The League of Nations cannot stand, it must also fall by the sword. Ezekiel 30:5.

pictures illustrated Screen the war engines invented for the coming fray and the operations of those war devils in the ocean, land and air, which will rain terror upon mankind. The radio plane is another modern war destructive invention. It is reported that this plane flies without an aviator—, registers the distance and destination; and is capable of utterly destroying a city at the will of the sender. And, according to the present war preparations more aerial battle will be fought than land or sea.

Since all nations will be focusing their gaze and directing their forces toward the Holy Land; the Lord tells us that He will muster the host of the battle. Isiah 13:4. Consequently, from the four corners of the earth they will marshal their forces and direct them as follows:

The Eastern nations will rush westward, and the Western nations will speed Eastward; while the Northern nations sweep Southward, the Southern nations will dash Northward; thence they will meet on the bloody battlefield of Palestine (of which Jerusalem is the storm centre. Ezekle, 5:5) and the mighty whirlwind of war and bloodshed spoken by the prophet

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Jeremiah will eventually burst. And, because of this terrible carnage, the slain of the Lord shall be at that day from one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth; they shall not be lamented, neither gathered, nor buried; they shall be dung upon the ground. Jer. 25:31-33.

The Lord through the prophet Isaiah gave a panoramic view of the great slaughter in the following language: "For the indignation of the Lord is upon all nations, and His fury upon all their armies: He hath utterly destroyed them, He hath delivered them to the slaughter. Their slain also shall be cast out, and their stink shall come up out of their carcases, and the mountains shall be melted with their blood." Isaiah 34:2, 3. All nations will be involved,—Malayan, Caucassian, Red Indian, Ethiopian and all nations on the globe will suffer alike.

Human blood will flow on the battlefields of Palestine 'till the horse's bridle is reached. Rev. No conquest will be gained, for this war will usher Messiah's second coming in the clouds of heaven. Hence, the fact remains irrefutable that no man or number of men on this sin-cursed earth can ever establish perpetual peace. Only Christ—the Prince of Peace can accomplish same, and put an end to this bloody business of war. For, says the Psalmist, "Come, behold the works of the Lord, what desolations He hath made in the earth. He maketh wars to cease unto the end of the earth; He breaketh the bow, and cutteth the spear in Sunder; He burneth the chariot in the fire. Psalm 46:7-9.

May the Lord help mankind to make sure His eternal salvation and flee from the wrath to come.

THE SABBATH QUESTION

"Hear ye my children the instruction of a father and attend to knowledge—understand. For I give you good doctrine forsake not my law." Prov. 4:1-2.

The law of God is indeed good doctrine, and every child of God should be very fond of it: for the law of the Lord is perfect converting the soul. Psa. 19:7. Without this law we are not so certain of our conversion.

We read in Romans 7:7-9: What shall we say then? Is the law sin? God forbid. Nay, I had not known sin, but by the law: for I had not known lust, except the law had said, Thou shalt not

We need not deceive ourselves nor let any one deceive us, for when the law comes, (comes to our knowledge) sin revives, (get up) and I die.

That very same law commands us to remember the Sabbath Day, not only remember it, but to keep it holy. In it thou shall not do any work. Ex. 20:8-11. The penalty of death is over the head of us who violate this command. Ex. 31:14-17. The wages of sin is death. Rom. 6:23. Therefore it is a sin to work on the Sabbath Day (Saturday).

Some people say "Christ arose on Sunday, the first day of the week, therefore Christians should keep that day." True, our Saviour did rise on the first day of the week, but the Sabbath of God's law had then passed. Mark 16:1-3. It took a great deal of hard work to raise Christ from the dead, for we read "And behold there was a great earthquake; for the angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat upon it. Math. 28:2. Such hard work is mentioned in Eph. 1:20. Which he wrought in Christ when He raised Him from the dead, and set Him at His right hand in the heavenly places.

God the Father did not work on the Seventh-day Sabbath, He rested on that day. Gen. 2:3. Christ His Son was an obedient Son. He worked in harmony with His Father. He said My Father worketh hitherto, and I work. (Up to Friday at sun set.) John 5:17.

We are taught by some that Christ changed the law of the Sabbath, but we hear Christ Himself say, "Think not that I am come to destroy the law or the prophets, I am not come to destroy but fulfill." He indicated that heaven and earth would pass before this law would pass. Math. 5:17-20; Jas. 2:9-13.

The Bible tells of a power which would think to change God's law, and time; in Dan. 7:25 we read, And he shall speak great words against the Most High, and wear out the saints of the Most High, and think to change times and laws. This power had already changed all the human laws on earth. Now he, like any wicked thing must tamper with the law and time of the Great and Mighty God. Mark, he only thinks to do this, he has a large crowd with him today, thinking the same thing. Remember our Saviour told us not to think so.

There is no part of God's law that speaks of time except the seventh-day Sabbath. True the power spoken of by the prophet Daniel is at work thinking to change God's time and law. The law of God cannot be changed. neither can the seventh-day (Saturday) the last day of the week, be changed into Sunday, the first day of the week, but people think so.

This wicked power which thinks to change God's time and law is called the beast. 7:23-24. This beast will finally taken and all the false prophets which have helped him tell us that Sunday, or the first day of the week, has taken the place of the seventh-day Sabbath (Saturday). The result is indeed fearful as recorded in Rev. 19:20; 20:10, 14.

The Lord is good to His people. He does not want any of us to perish or be lost. 2 Peter, 3:9. He admonishes the brethren also to be patient unto the coming of the Lord. Jas. 5:7. And He sends the whole world a timely warning. All of this shows that He does not want any of us lost.

Again the people raiseth the objection of God's Holy Sabbath

as being the Sabbath of the Jews: this is partly true, but we read in Romans 3:29, "Is He the God of the Jew only? Is He not of the Gentiles also? Yea, of the Gentiles also."

Instead of our faith in Christ destroying the law of God, it establishes it. Rom. 3:31. He is a Jew which is one inwardly the Bible says. Rom. 2:29. Salvation is of the Jews, says our Saviour. "Ye worship ye know not what; we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews." John

We believing Gentiles should not boast against the branches (the Jews) for some of them were cut off because of unbelief, and we who stand by faith should take heed, for if God spared not those who did not believe then, who should fear less He spares us not. 11:18-23.

Let us, therefore, fear, lest, a promise be left us of entering into His rest, any of you should come short of it, For we which have believed do enter into rest. as He said. For He spake in a certain place (Mt. Sinai) on this wise. And God did rest the Seventh Day. And in this place again (anywhere you are) if they shall enter into my rest. Heb. 4:1-6.
